Safe feed for animals

Meeting regulatory requirements

Feed Ingredients and Additives must meet a range of regulatory requirements. The requirements are not the same for all. Here are some examples:

- Veterinary medicines must be registered with the APVMA.
- Veterinary herbal remedies that claim to cure a condition must be registered with the APVMA.
- Whole unprocessed plant materials, fed as part of the normal animal diet to help maintain normal health, don't need registration.
- Nutritional supplements may not need to be registered if they are only to supplement diets where levels are low, but they may require a permit from DAWR for importation.
- Excluded nutritional or digestive (END) products must comply with the AgVet Code. FIAAA members certified to our Code of Practice can meet this requirement.

Do your END products comply?

A quick summary of requirements for END products*

HOW USED

- Feed voluntarily consumed by an animal.

INGREDIENTS

- Generally recognised as safe.
- No ingredients such as hormones and antibiotics.

MANUFACTURE

- Quality system, particularly the **FIAAA Code of Practice**.

LABELLING

- Claims to alleviate or prevent a disease or condition, are supported by data.
- All required wording included.

What if you can't meet the requirements?

- ⇒ It is illegal to sell the product. The product must either be registered or comply with all END requirements.

How does FIAAA help members?

- ✓ Guidance on AgVet Code requirements.
- ✓ Certification to the FIAAA COP meets the Quality System requirement for END products.
